2023 National Blacksmith Survey Exhibition Entry details and Conditions

The Glasshouse Regional Gallery in Port Macquarie is hosting a national survey exhibition of blacksmithing contemporary practice to celebrate the craftsmanship and creativity of hot forged iron in Australia.

This exhibition is organised and supported by the Artist Blacksmith Association of NSW and aims to celebrate the blacksmithing craft with examples of work from all states and territories and makers from diverse backgrounds.

Entry Conditions

This is the first national survey of contemporary blacksmithing practice in Australia and we encourage all types of blacksmithing from diverse makers to enter work for this exhibition.

Entry is free with a maximum of 2 entries per maker.

A separate entry form will be required to be filled out for each entry.

Each entry must:

- be no more than three years old.
- be the original work of the maker.
- have been made in Australia.
- have hot forging as a substantial part of the work.

Selection criteria

The focus is on current creative modes of blacksmithing. The mission is to showcase the diversity of what forging can offer from the technical to expressive, the conceptual, the sculptural or beautifully functional. These modes of making often depend on and influence each other and, as such, the evaluation and acceptance of work will be strongly influenced by how a work demonstrates a harmony between its intention, execution and the interest it provokes in the viewer.

This is a professionally curated and juried exhibition. Work will be selected by an independent selection panel consisting of:

Bridget Purtill – The Glasshouse Gallery curator.

Doug Mosely – Highly experienced Blacksmith from South Australia.

Artists both successful and unsuccessful in their entry will be notified.

Gerry Bobsien – Director of Maitland Regional Art Gallery and former blacksmith.

The amount of works selected is at the discretion of the selection panel. The Selection Committee will consider all entries and their decision will be final.

Size and weight: The exhibition space is generous and the gallery has a modern loading bay. However if your work weighs more than 100kg or more than 3m in any direction you must discuss this with the curator (contact details below) before it can be accepted into the show. The gallery can accept and display large works but has to make allowances for handling them.

Insurance: The Gallery is unable to insure works in transit or while on loan in the show. Any insurance cover will be the responsibility of the Artist.

Delivery and Collection: Transport and/or shipping costs of all work is the responsibility of the Artist. Work must be delivered Friday 24th November at 10am unless discussed prior with Curator.

We do have limited funding to assist with transport costs which will be allocated on a needs basis. Any funding allocation will be finalised after the selection process and priority will be given where multiple works can be shipped together from a single point. Any funding is likely to only partially cover costs. We plan to utilise various collection points at various blacksmiths workshops to facilitate delivery. Sales: The Gallery will take 33.3% commission from any sales. Work does not need to be for sale.

Collaborative work: Blacksmiths from all over the country can contribute to the 'Needle Stack' collaboration. See separate outline document for details also available at the <u>ABANSW website</u>. No entry form is required to be part of this project just make a needle/s gather them together with other local smiths and post them off to the collection point for inclusion in the final work.
